### President's Message

# Challenging Financial Times

Everyone is experiencing higher costs at the gas pump, grocery store, and for other goods and services. The Tanglewood North HOA Board has been planning our 2022 budget and we have all found the process this year to be exceptionally challenging.

While the inflation rate is estimated to be around 5% for 2021, the cost proposals we are receiving from our service providers and contractors for 2022 contracts are reflecting increases ranging between 10% and 17%. Utilities are also climbing faster than the inflation rate. As a result, the Board has approved a budget that addresses the financial challenges with a two-pronged approach:

- 1. An increase in HOA dues
- 2. Cost reductions through operational changes and modifying project priorities and scope.

Effective January 1, 2022, our monthly association dues will increase \$15 per month, which amounts to a 5.3% increase. With this increase, the monthly HOA dues for 2022 will be \$300. As the Board considered a ten-year budget plan earlier this year, the Board was anticipating an increase of \$5 per month. Unfortunately, the substantial operating cost increases necessitated our revisiting that plan.

You can see with 2022 increased costs ranging from 10% - 17% funded by a due increase of 5.3%, we will be required to seek ways to reduce costs without compromising the quality of life we all enjoy in our Tanglewood North community. Our plans for the continuity of operations and protecting our assets, preserving our pools, structures, greenbelts and common areas are unchanged and during the next ten years we will be prioritizing many financial decisions including replacing roofs, completing our exterior painting, removing trees that are damaging our

walkways and trees that have reached the end of their life cycle, replastering pools, and tending to the many other areas that come with maintaining an Association that is now over 55 years of age.

It is our hope that as the economy continues to move beyond the pandemic and the supply of goods and services normalize that we will see a reduction in the rate of inflation and the leveling off of cost increases we have been experiencing.

This was not the news I wanted to deliver to you, but tough decisions needed to be made to ensure we can meet the current and future financial obligations of the Association.

your absence. A vacation house check can be requested on the City of Cypress web site on the police department fees and services page. Also, a VACATION HOUSE CHECK form can be picked up at police department business lobby. Ruth is part of a two person team, along with other teams, who perform these checks. They check the perimeter of the property to make sure there isn't anything out of place. They check on windows and doors to make sure they are locked or as the owners left them.

The volunteers will also pick up newspapers, flyers

etc. and place them in the side or back yard, out of sight. If there is anything which looks out of place or suspicious, the volunteers will call dispatch and request an officer to respond. Once the vacation house check is completed and the owners have returned, the volunteers will send a letter advising how many times the house was checked and if anything unusual was noticed. We are fortunate because very few cities provide this service. It's so nice to know one of our own board members most likely will be one of the teams watching over you. How nice is that!
